The National Volunteer Week officially took root in the U.S. in 1974, many thanks to the 37th U.S. President, Richard Nixon, who established it with an executive order. It has since become a tradition followed by other emerging presidents to date, growing to incorporate different willing participants and featuring a variety of projects and events that span throughout the week. The National Volunteer Week is organized by the U.S. organization — Points of Light Foundation whose mission is "to inspire, equip, and mobilize people to take actions that change the world" and Volunteering Canada — a charity initiative that provides expertise on volunteerism with the lens on increasing participation and quality of volunteer experiences.

Texas 4-H Youth Leadership Teams

There are 9 unique teams in which senior level youth can participate in as Ambassadors or Texas 4-H Council. Those groups include:

Texas 4-H Council

Members of this team are elected by their peers from across the state of Texas, representing the twelve AgriLife Extension districts plus an additional six At-Large Delegates. The Texas 4-H Council members serve as ambassadors for the Texas 4-H program. Members represent the organization statewide while collaborating with Extension faculty to plan, coordinate, and facilitate activities and events.

Equine Ambassadors

This program provides high school aged 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills related to mentoring other youth, and to become advocates for the equine industry in Texas.

· Fashion & Interior Design Ambassadors

This program strives to provide high school aged 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills to mentor other youth, and to become knowledgeable representatives for the Fashion & Interior Design industry.

Healthy Texas Youth Ambassadors

This Program is for senior level 4-H youth that are motivated, excited, and ready to make a change in their community! These youth are trained at the regional level to become youth health experts who can motivate others to make a change in their lifestyle to improve their health, and assist county agents in programming.

Livestock Ambassadors

This program strives to provide high school aged 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills related to mentoring other youth, and to become advocates for animal agriculture.

Photography Ambassadors

This program provides opportunities to grow in the photography project through community service, workshops, training sessions, field trips, and leadership/citizenship activities. Members must first complete the requirements to become a Junior Master Photographer.

Poultry Ambassadors

This program strives to provide high school aged 4-H members the opportunity to develop and practice advanced leadership skills related to mentoring other youth, and to become advocates for the poultry industry.

Shooting Sports Ambassadors

This group serves as spokespersons for the 4-H Shooting Sports program, helping to make 4-H Shooting Sports programs more visible. The Ambassadors further develop their skills in leadership, public presentation, citizenship, community service, public relations and team building.

STEM Ambassadors

This program involves a youth-adult partnership structure to promote, educate, and inspire others in the area of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Members should have a strong interest in promoting STEM. The team meets throughout the year to develop and support programs in areas such as robotics, photography, and video production.

Water Ambassadors

This program provides youth an opportunity to gain advanced knowledge and practice leadership skills related to the science, technology, engineering, and management of water in Texas.

Opportunities:

Each of the nine groups offer unique experiences that allow for further exploration in that subject area. Most groups have a training or shortcourse during the summer. Most of the Ambassador groups offer additional opportunities as the youth progress through the specific program. Some of the Ambassador groups offer international or domestic experiences to learn more about that industry and cultural differences. The youth in all of the groups will develop leadership and public speaking skills, learn how to advocate for the program area in which they are participating, and become spokespersons for the 4-H program as a whole.

Did you know?

4-H is a club for kids and teens to develop life skills and make friends. Youth can join 4-H in all 254 counties. Everybody ages 8-18 and in 3rd-12th grades can join 4-H. Kids in Kindergarten to 2nd grades can join as Clover Kids. There are 43 different project areas in five project categories: Agriculture & Livestock, Family & Community Health, Leadership & Citizenship, Natural Resources, and STEM.

May 10, 2024 - Deadline for Candidacy Filing to run for office (D12 4-H website)

May 25, 2024 - Candidate interviews via TEAMS - a link will be provided.

May 31, 2024 - Deadline for Voter Registration to serve as a voting delegate (D12 4-H website)

May 31, 2024 - Deadline for Election Judge Applications (D12 4-H website)

May 31, 2024 – Deadline to register all attending including candidates, delegates, guests, age (via 4-H Online – Youth or Adult profiles).

The 2024 District 12 4-H Officer Election process has changed due to the November 11, 2024, District 12 4-H Meeting. The letter will outline changes as well as The Election Code (Revised 12/2023) and the Standing Rules (Revised (12/2023) adopted by the District Council. Please forward this information to your candidates and voting delegates and have them review this thoroughly. Candidacy filing opens March 25, 2024, through the deadline of May 10, 2024. Please take note of the important dates.
